
Motivation of Our Work

Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Reservation and Trust Lands




Self-Governance and Trust lands

Land for which the federal government holds legal title but the beneficial interest remains with the Tribe.

Trust lands are the only <u>lands</u> over which the Tribes can impose policy.
