- created by Dr. Sarah Mills and her team

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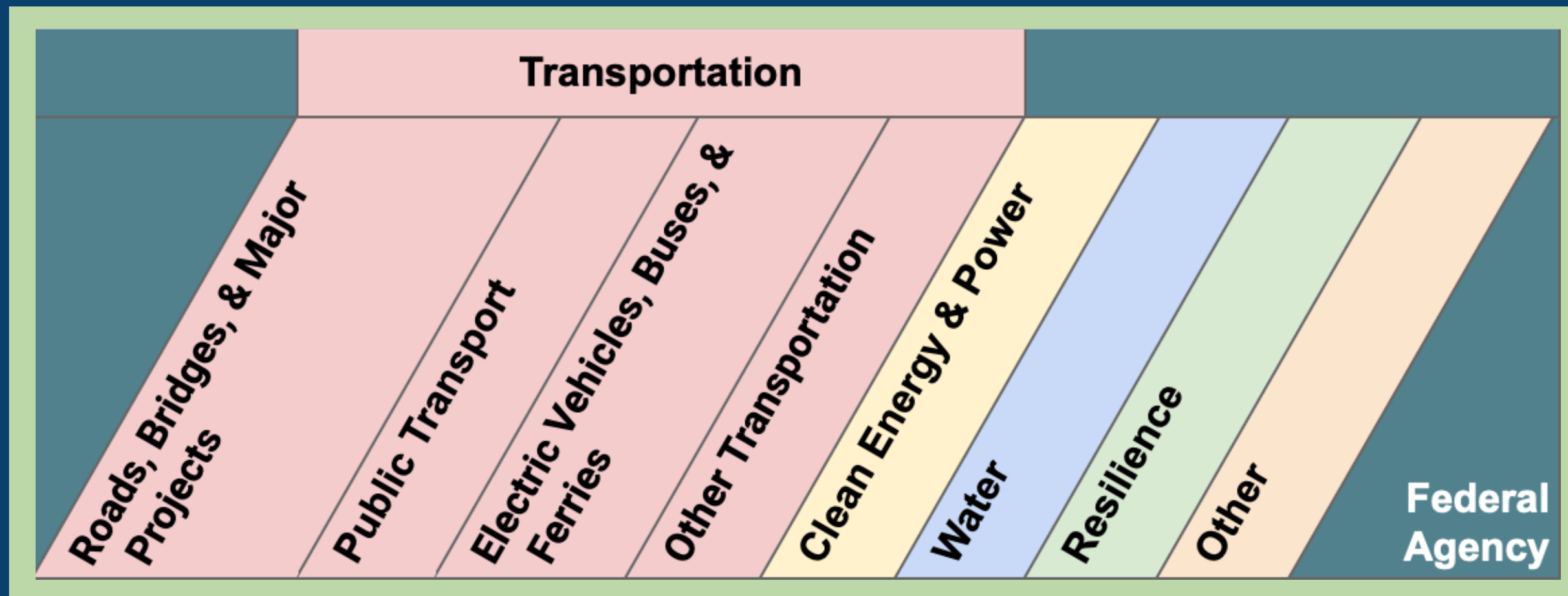

IIJA FUNDING TRACKER

- Clients had concerns that the categories that the funding opportunities were sorted by were not specific enough and not applicable to communities looking to hit sustainability goals
- the tracker lacked any broadband funding opportunities for local communities

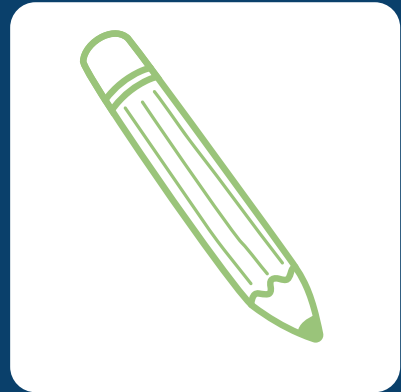



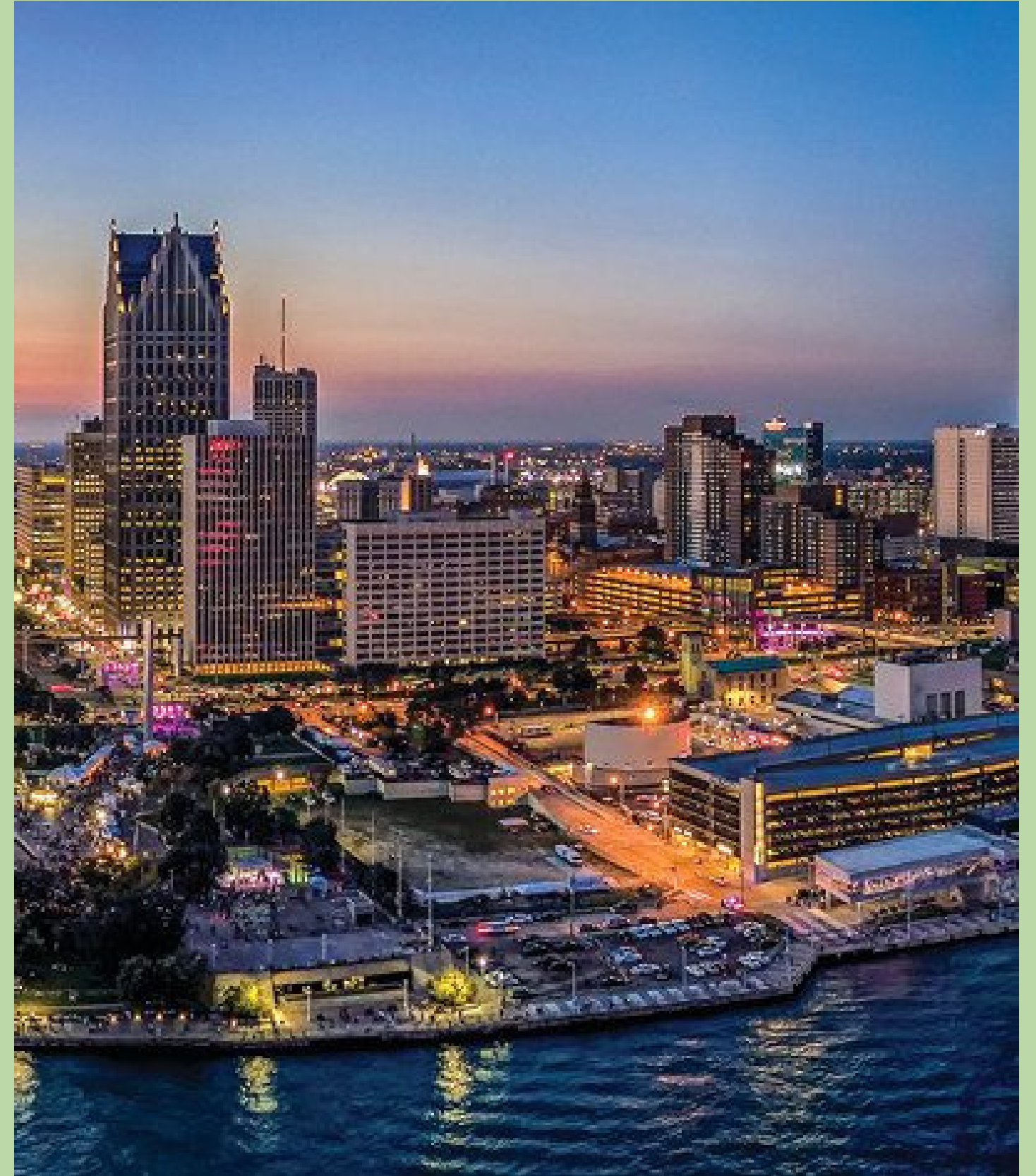
